Many of them feel trapped by their circumstances and can barely see beyond their village. As we looked over an assembly of 700 children at Kisozi I was once more aware of God's call on many of their lives. Just as they are now receiving a message of His Love as children, so many of them are being called to be **carriers of this good news** to their families, communities and some are being challenged to go even further!

We gave an opportunity for those feeling this call to be prayed with. It was good to see so many teenager boys stand alongside the girls and to allow God to move in their hearts and lives.
